

## WHO WE ARE

Right To Read is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides no-cost reading intervention and literacy resources to black and hispanic students in kindergarten through third grade who are at risk for reading failure.

Founded in 2020 by a licensed dyslexia therapist and certified academic language therapist, Right To Read's commitment to literacy success is provided through:

- Individualized reading support to meet the needs of each individual student
- Assessments, community partnerships, parent education and teacher mentorship.

One of the most important predictors of graduating from high school is proficient reading by the end of third grade.

## WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

#### LEARNING TO READ IS A CIVIL RIGHT

Students reading below a third grade level are associated with incarceration, poverty rates, school drop-out rates and future academic challenges. Only 18% of Black students and 23% of Hispanic students scored at or above a proficient reading level in 2019. (NAEP)

#### ACADEMIC FAILURE IS ROOTED IN POOR READING SKILLS

The link between academic failure and delinquency, violence, and crime is welded to reading failure.

#### TOO MANY STUDENTS ARE FALLING BEHIND

Children who are not reading on grade level by the end of third grade have a 1 in 8 chance of catching up and are 4x more likely to drop out of school.

### READING SUCCESS BUILDS SELF ESTEEM

Learning to read and mastering that skill transforms a student's self esteem and empowers their desire for personal and academic success.
